

## **2024 Lakes Athletic Hall of Fame Class**

### **Dean Londo**

#### ***Coach 1973-1996***

Dean Londo was the first Varsity girls basketball coach in Lake Linden-Hubbell's history. He held the reigns of the program for 24 seasons from 1973 through 1996. His teams finished with a cumulative record of 289 wins and 219 losses. He led the Lakes to 10 conference championships and 5 district titles, developing one of the most consistent and respected girls programs in the U.P. during his coaching tenure.

For 13 straight seasons, from 1978 through 1990, Dean's teams never had a losing record. It was during this impressive span that the Lakes captured 2 district titles and 8 conference championships. Dean garnered numerous Coach of the Year awards during his time at the helm in recognition of the quality program he began and built over those 24 seasons.

To date, Dean Londo is still the longest tenured and winningest Varsity coach in the history of the Lakes girls basketball program.

### **Kenn Clouthier**

#### ***Athlete 1976-1980***

Kenn Clouthier was a three sport, seven letter Varsity athlete for Lake Linden Hubbell during his playing career participating in football, basketball and track and really came into his own during his senior year.

On the gridiron, Kenn led an 8-1 Lakes team in receiving yards and was tied for 5<sup>th</sup> in individual scoring among all eleven western U.P. teams. For his efforts, Kenn was named Great Western All-Conference Honorable Mention.

In track, Kenn recorded numerous first place finishes all season long in the 440 and 880 yard dashes along with being a member of a very successful mile relay team. He placed first in the 440 yard dash in the Regional meet and went on to medal in the 1980 U.P. Finals.

It was during the 1979-1980 basketball season where Kenn truly excelled. He led the Lakes in scoring and rebounding, led the conference in scoring, was in the top 10 in scoring in the U.P. among Class D schools, and was named All-Conference First Team in the Copper Country and Great Western Conferences. Kenn was named the 1980 Funke Award winner his senior year which was given annually to the Outstanding Senior Athlete in the Copper Country Conference. He is still among the leaders in several scoring categories in Lake Linden-Hubbell boys basketball history. Kenn went on to play basketball for two years at Suomi College.

### **Kenneth Anderson**

#### ***Athlete 1965-1969***

Ken Anderson is a 1969 graduate of the Lake Linden-Hubbell Schools. During his high school career, he participated in Varsity football for two years, Varsity basketball for four years as well as four years of track and field.

During the 1967-68 season, Kenneth was named Best Defensive Player and was recognized for the Best Field Goal Percentage. In 1968-69, he received honors for Best Defensive Player, Best Field Goal Percentage and was named Most Valuable Player. The team defeated the Number 1 seed, Ewen-Trout Creek, in the first round of the districts that year and he was the high scorer with 19 points.

Kenneth really shined in track and field breaking several school records. He was named All State in 1968 and 1969. He broke the school record in the 880 yard relay, 440 yard dash and the long jump. In his junior year, he took First Place in the long jump with a 19'6" jump. The next year, as a senior, he broke the U.P. record with a jump of 22'0". This record still stands today.

**Andy Crouch**  
***Athlete 1988-1992***  
***Coach 1997-2019***

Andy Crouch is a 1992 graduate of the Lake Linden-Hubbell Schools where he lettered in football, basketball and track. In 1991 he served as the football Team Captain when he led the Lakes to the State Finals. He also earned All Conference, All U.P. and All State honors that year.

In 1997, Andy began his long tenure in coaching when he began as Assistant Football Coach. The Lakes won the State championship that year. From 2002 to 2019, Andy served as Head Football Coach. The Lakes held a 120-57 record with 13 playoff appearances, 6 conference championships and were named U.P. Team of the Year four times. Andy was honored as Coach of the Year at the conference, regional, U.P. and State levels numerous times.

Andy was part of the development of the U.P. All Star Football Game and has been recognized as Head Coach several times. Lake Linden-Hubbell has had athletes chosen to participate in this event year after year.

In 2023, Andy was nominated for the Michigan High School Coaches Association Hall of Fame. From 2021 to 2023, Andy served as Running Backs Coach for Finlandia University and this year has been the Defensive Backs Coach for Michigan Tech University.

In addition to years of coaching Lakes football, Andy was the Junior Varsity boys basketball coach. He also coached track for a few years, during which time the teams won conference and regional championships and he was twice named Conference Coach of the Year.

**Jamie Koskela**  
***Athlete 1989-1993***  
***Coach 2000-2020***

Jamie Koskela is a 1993 graduate of the Lake Linden-Hubbell Schools. Jamie was an All U.P. player in football and basketball and was one point away from playing for three State championships. Jamie was a member of the 1992 State championship team and led the Lakes to that victory.

As a basketball player, Jamie earned many honors for accomplishments that put him in the record book.

In 2000, Jamie returned to Lake Linden Hubbell as a teacher and a coach. Often staying behind the scene, his dedication to the athletes and our program played a key role in the many successes and achievements of our teams.
